THIERRY TROOSTERS, PT, PhD

Prof Thierry Troosters is head of the Research Centre for Cardiovascular and Respiratory Rehabilitation at Katholieke Universiteit Leuven (Belgium). He has been elected as the chair of the working group on Physiotherapy of the European Respiratory Society and also appointed as chair of the Belgian Society for Respiratory Physiotherapy.

Prof Troosters remains active in clinical research where his interests include: pulmonary rehabilitation, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), skeletal and respiratory muscle function, exercise training, physical activity, and patient reported outcomes in COPD. His current research has a focus on physical activity and its interaction with systemic consequences of respiratory diseases. He also studies the short and long term consequences of acute exacerbations of COPD. He is a partner in several international projects with academic partners and partners from the pharmaceutical industry. He is the scientific coordinator of the first innovative medicines initiative project in COPD: PROactive. In 2009 Prof Troosters gave the 'Cournand Lecture' at the European Rspiratory Society congress.
